- Is the meeting place of the U.S. Congress
- It sits atop Capitol Hill at the eastern end of the National Mall
- It is built in the neoclassical style and has a white exterior

The White House

- The official residence and principal workplace of the President of the United States
- Located at 1600 Pennsylvania Avenue NW in Washington, D.C.
- Designed by Irish-born James Hoban (1792 -1800)
- Built of white-painted sandstone in the Neoclassical style
- Was ranked second on "America's Favorite Architecture" list

Thomas Jefferson Memorial



Thomas Jefferson Memorial

- Dedicated to Thomas Jefferson, an American Founding Father and the third President of the United States
- Built in the neoclassical style
- Adaptation of the ancient Roman Pantheon
- The bronze statue of Jefferson holding the Declaration of Independence was added in 1947

Lincoln Memorial

- Built to honor the 16th President of the United States, Abraham Lincoln
- Located on the National Mall across from the Washington Monument
- In the form of a Greek Doric temple
- Contains a large seated sculpture of Abraham Lincoln
- Has been the site of many famous speeches, including Martin Luther King's "I Have a Dream" speech

Washington Monument

- An obelisk on the National Mall, east of the Reflecting Pool and the Lincoln Memorial
- Built to commemorate George Washington, once commander-in-chief of the early Continental Army and the first American president
- Made of marble, granite, and bluestone gneiss
- The world's tallest stone structure and the world's tallest obelisk

The Vietnam Veterans Memorial

- Honors U.S. service members of the U.S. armed forces who fought in the Vietnam War
- Consists of three separate parts:
 - The Three Soldiers statue
 - The Vietnam Women's Memorial
 - The Vietnam Veterans Memorial Wall - the best-known part
- Located in Constitution Gardens adjacent to the National Mall
